Dr. Saunders is originally from South Africa where she did her undergraduate and postgraduate training, including interventions for the behavioural complications of dementia.</p>

She works as a nurse consultant for Island Health and has been the coordinator for the Medical Assistance in Dying Program since 2016. She has been involved with research into advanced illness since 2009, and has focused on metaphor, spirituality and death and dying. She is currently funded for two narrative studies related to assisted dying.</p> <p>Rosanne’s goal has been and continues to be inspiring relational practice and ethical care. Her practice reflects a heartfelt conviction that we are the other and are all connected. She is an advocate for patient choice and believes it crucial that we invite, honor, and lean into patient stories; that we hear and accept each individual’s unique lived experience without judgement.</p>
